

Job Title: Install Helper

Work Hours: 6:00 – 4:00, Monday through Friday, some overtime

Primary Job Function: Provide support to Journeyman Lead as required for successful, timely completion

of HVAC projects: transferring equipment/materials; installing HVAC equipment, duct and fittings as directed; keeping job site clean, etc. Maintain required levels of

truck stock items. Be available when at office facility to assist with ad hoc

repair/maintenance projects for shop and yard. Present a positive image of ICS to

customers, including neat, clean appearance,

Reports To: Operations Manager

Daily Duties:

- 1. Responsible for HVAC install duties as assigned by Install Lead.
- 2. Available at scheduled daily check-in time, ready to be dispatched.
- 3. Complete paper work daily, recording all hours worked on each job; turn into Operations Manager.
- 4. Assist Warehouse Person or Fabricator as directed with stocking, pulling jobs, deliveries, or fabrication.
- 5. Keep entire work area and work van neat and organized and free of scrap and debris.
- 6. Assist as needed in repair and maintenance projects at office facility.
- 7. Proactively pursue additional HVAC licensing and certifications to increase level of skill as an Installer.

Performance Indicators: Certain key business indicators will measure the effectiveness of the Install Helper.

These include the following:

- 1. Ability to work effectively with Install Lead and other Helpers to complete projects on time.
- 2. Maintain driving record that qualifies as an insured ICS driver.
- 3. Efficiency in assisting with fabrication.
- 4. Accuracy & timeliness of time cards, with install hours charged to projects correctly.
- 5. Number of warranty callbacks on workmanship that are processed for the Install Helper each month.
- 6. Number of times fittings are built or installed incorrectly.
- 7. Cleanliness and organization of the project work site and van.
- 8. Number of equipment, tool, or vehicle breaks due to lack of proper maintenance or neglect.
- 9. Number of times the work of the Helper fails to meet ICS standards.
- 10. Number of new HVAC licensing or certifications acquired.

- Ability and willingness to participate in office facility maintenance/repair 11.
- projects.

 Helpers are to be evaluated and to perform at a skill level equivalent to their ability and level of training provided. 12.
